

TRANSPORTATION FOR STUDENTS ON IEP'S

GENERAL INFORMATION

Curb to Curb refers to the vehicle and what the vehicle does.

Door to Door is a step further which requires a hand-off at the door of the residence to the door of the bus and from the door of the school to the door of the bus. This is hardly used, but would specify that someone from the school would hand off the student to the bus driver and the bus driver would hand of the student to a caregiver.

Most IEPs indicate curb to curb with specifics if necessary based on student need. Supervision requirements for students receiving curb to curb is typically taken from the services section of the IEP.

CODE OF COLORADO REGULATIONS – RULES FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN'S EDUCATIONAL ACT

- 2.37(3)(o) Transportation includes
 - 2.37(3)(o)(i) Travel to and from school and between schools;
 - 2.37(3)(o)(ii) Travel in and around school buildings; and
 - 2.37(3)(o)(iii) Specialized equipment (such as special or adapted buses, lifts, and ramps), if required to provide special transportation for a child with a disability.

EXAMPLE SPECIAL TRANSPORTATION QUALIFICATION STATEMENTS:

Affective Needs: Due to safety concerns arising from difficulties with behavior, student qualifies for Special Transportation with curb to curb and securement.

Significant Support Needs: Student qualifies for Specialized Transportation due to curb to curb securement and the use of a harness for securement for safety.

Autism: Due to safety concerns arising from difficulties with communication and seating safely on the bus, student qualifies for Special Transportation with curb to curb and securement.

STUDENT WITH SPECIFIC NEEDS BEYOND GENERAL CURB TO CURB:

Student will be attending a specialized programming outside of her homeschool and therefore qualifies for specialized transportation.

- -Two adult assist ascending/descending bus stairs; with first adult giving posterior min touch assist to child while descend and second adult giving contact guard assist in front of child at bottom of steps
- -One adult with contact guard assist during motor activities such as navigating standard stairs and/or playground equipment
- -Securement is needed for Student on the bus
